

Our FINANCIALS

We continue to execute our 2024 plan of providing additional assistance through our Food Pantry to the four counties we serve of Coweta, Fayette, Meriwether and Spalding. With inflation continuing and poverty on the increase, God has guided us to fulfill these needs for as long as we can. We are stretched financially each month as we serve an increased client base each week. The past four weeks we have provided for 5-15 new families each week. Each family averages 3.75 members.

Poverty averaged together for the four counties we serve is 14.12% (2020 census). As grocery and energy costs remain high, these 2020 numbers are probably low. The I-58 Food Pantry has distributed 36.9 % more in food in 2024. Year-to-date in 2024 this has increased costs \$85,690.

Thanks to our partners, the I-58 warehouse is complete and functioning well. We are now able to have storage space for non-perishable foods, clothes closet, home goods, baby room and special event items. The warehouse is functioning well with new industrial shelving that allows us to take advantage of bulk packaged donations, storage for our large community event items and our bed ministry.

This has freed up space in our main building to enable us to operate more efficiently in all areas or the Ministry. The main building has new improvements of shelving in the food pantry. We also now have a room in the lower level that enables us to provide some personal services and counseling to our clients in private.

Thank you to all the donors, contractors, volunteers and others who made all of this possible for I-58. The needs are great but you, the givers, are amazing.
